1. Royce classifies a client account as 'Core' because it anticipates the client account equity holdings will have a weighted average price-to-book ratio or weighted average normalized price-to-earnings ratio that is similar to, or somewhat higher than, its general asset class. 2. Geometric Average. This weighted calculation uses each portfolio holding's market cap in a way designed to not skew the effect of very large or small holdings; instead, it aims to better identify the portfolio's center, which Royce believes offers a more accurate measure of average market cap than a simple mean or median. 3. Active Share is the sum of the absolute values of the different weightings of each holding in the Fund versus each holding in the benchmark, divided by two. 4. Net leverage is the percentage, in excess of 100%, of the total value of equity type investments, divided by net assets. 5. Harmonic Average. This weighted calculation evaluates a portfolio as if it were a single stock and measures it overall. It compares the total market value of the portfolio's share in the earnings or book value, as the case may be, of its underlying stocks. 6. The Price-to-Earnings Ratio is calculated by dividing a company's share price by its trailing 12-month earnings-per-share (EPS) and also excludes companies with zero or negative earnings (15% of Portfolio holdings as of 3/31/24). 7. The Price-to-Book Ratio is calculated by dividing a company's share price by its book value per share (5% of Portfolio holdings were excluded as of 3/31/24).

The Morningstar Style Map uses proprietary scores of a stock's value and growth characteristics to determine its placement in one of the five categories listed on the horizontal axis. These characteristics are then compared to those of other stocks within the same market capitalization band. Each is scored from zero to 100 for both value and growth attributes. The value score is subtracted from the growth score to determine the overall style score. For the vertical, market cap axis, Morningstar subdivides into size groups. Giant-cap stocks are defined as those that account for the top 40% of the capitalization of each style zone; large-cap stocks represent the next 30%; mid-cap stocks the next 20%; smallcap stocks the next 7%; micro-cap stocks the smallest 3%. Market Capitalization is calculated by multiplying a company's share price by its shares outstanding. Standard deviation is a statistical measure within which a client account's total returns have varied over time. The greater the standard deviation, the greater a portfolio's volatility.
